# **2024 SPRING CLEAN-UP IS SATURDAY, MAY 4th**

It's that time of year to spruce up our town ..... clean up and clean out!

A dumpster and a scrap metal trailer will be located at the park on:

> Saturday, May 4th 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.

This is for Rudyard Township residents...please bring ID with you. It is for those items not picked up on your weekly trash collection schedule.

NO hazardous materials, liquid paint, brush or yard waste, computer monitors, fluorescent light bulbs or tires. Please do not dump household garbage. \*\*NO air conditioners or refrigerators\*\*

There will be someone on site to check ID and monitor dumpster items.

If you see trash in the common areas around town, feel free to pick it up.

# Do you have scrap tires lying around? We can help!

You can pick up a Scrap Tire Voucher at the township office to be redeemed at either U.P. Tire in S.S.M. or Mark's Tire in Brimley. Each household in Rudyard Township qualifies for up to \$25 in disposal value from April 1, 2024— March 31, 2025. If you are a Rudyard Township resident, stop by the township office for a voucher: Monday-Thursday between 10:00 A.M. and 3:30 P.M.

If you are planning construction, an addition, or moving in a mobile/ modular home, you

will need to fill out a Zoning **Compliance Site Plan.** Stop at the Rudyard Township Office, 18725 S Mackinac Trail, to pick up your form. There is a \$50 application fee. Building Permits are issued through Chippewa County. You will need a Zoning Compliance Site Plan completed to go with your county

building permit application.

Doing any DIY Projects? Know what's below before you dig! When you contact MISS DIG811, the public facility companies are notified to mark the location of their lines. Public facilities are marked for FREE. Locators will paint lines and/or place flags to mark the location of

underground public lines. Go to www.missdig811.org for all the information you need!

We have recycling bins located in front of the pavilion for clean glass bottles and jars, clean plastic bottles and jars, newspaper, magazines, catalogs, and metal or aluminum cans.

If you have questions or concerns about this year's application of dust-control brine on the gravel roads, please call the office. Brining usually takes place in late May or early June.



Cemetery

According to the township cemetery ordinance, 'no burial spaces shall be opened & closed without the control of the township'. Call the township to arrange all burials. The cemetery sexton will mark the location in the plot and we will record it in our books. This will insure that our records are kept updated and accurate. There is a fee for opening & closing both full and cremation burials. If burials are done prior to contacting the township, you will still receive a bill for that service plus an additional fee.
